STATE RESEARCH COMMITTEES TO BE ESTABLISHED

THE SRDG BOARD HAS ENCOURAGED THE OUTREACH COMMITTEE TO BEGIN ESTABLISHING STATE RESEARCH COMMITTEES WITH THE MANDATE TO FACILITATE POPULATION RESEARCH IN EACH STATE. A PRIME OBJECTIVE OF THE COMMITTEES WILL BE TO ENHANCE THE LINKAGES BETWEEN STATE AND LOCAL DEMOGRAPHERS AND THE ACADEMIC COMMUNITY. EACH COMMITTEE WILL BE ASKED TO PARTICIPATE IN GENERATING A DEMOGRAPHIC ANALYSIS OF THEIR STATE AND TO IDENTIFY IMPORTANT DEMOGRAPHIC ISSUES FACING THE STATE. THE OUTREACH COMMITTEE HOPES THIS ACTIVITY WILL LEAD TO NEW SRDG WORKING PAPERS AND HAS BEGUN DISCUSSIONS WITH NATIONAL ORGANIZATIONS LIKE THE POPULATION RESOURCES CENTER AND THE ENVIRONMENTAL FUND TO HELP BRING VISIBILITY TO THE END PRODUCTS OF THE RESEARCH EFFORTS. NEWS FROM THE CENSUS BUREAU

THE CENSUS BUREAU HAS AVAILABLE TWO PUBLIC USE TAPES OF INTEREST TO SRDG MEMBERS. IN ONE MICRODATA FROM THE MARCH, APRIL, AND JUNE CURRENT POPULATION SURVEYS (CPS) ARE MATCHED TO ALLOW ANALYSIS OF ECONOMIC DATA FROM THE MARCH CPS FOR FOREIGN BORN AND FROM APRIL FOR NATIVE BORN WITH FERTILITY DATA FROM JUNE. IN THE SECOND, RESPONSES ARE MATCHED FROM THE MARCH AND JUNE 1983 CPS. FOR MORE INFORMATION ABOUT THE CONTENT AND STRUCTURE OF THE TAPES, CALL MARTIN O'CONNELL AT 301-763-5303. MICRODATA FILES FROM THE SURVEY OF INCOME AND PROGRAM PARTICIPATION (SIPP) ARE AVAILABLE FROM THE DATA USER SERVICES DIVISION. BASED ON A NATIONALLY REPRESENTATIVE SAMPLE OF HOUSEHOLDS, SIPP CONTAINS INFORMATION ON SOURCES OF INCOME, ELIGIBILITY FOR AND PARTICIPATION IN GOVERNMENT TRANSFER PROGRAMS, LABOR FORCE STATUS, DISABILITY, ASSETS, LIABILITIES, PENSION COVERAGE, TAXES, AND OTHER ITEMS OF INTEREST TO DEMOGRAPHERS. THIS FILE CONTAINS DATA FROM THE OCTOBER 1983 AND JANUARY 1984 INTERVIEWS. THE BUREAU ALSO HAS A WORKING PAPER SERIES TO PROVIDE ACCESS TO INFORMATION DEVELOPED AS PART OF SIPP. THE BUREAU WILL HOLD ITS FIRST ANNUAL RESEARCH CONFERENCE ON MARCH 20-23, 1985, IN RESTON, VA. THIS CONFERENCE WILL PROVIDE A FORUM FOR RESEARCHERS TO DISCUSS CURRENT RESEARCH AND METHODS IN THE DEVELOPMENT AND IMPROVEMENT OF STATISTICAL PROGRAMS RELEVANT TO THE BUREAU. SESSION TOPICS WILL INCLUDE SURVEY DESIGN AND ESTIMATION, EVALUATION OF DATA QUALITY, PROJECTION METHODOLOGY,

CONFIDENTIALITY OF FEDERAL STATISTICS, NONRESPONSE ADJUSTMENTS, THE UNDERGROUND ECONOMY, AND VALUATION OF NON-CASH BENEFITS, AMONG OTHERS. A TYPICAL SESSION WILL INCLUDE A PAPER BY BUREAU STAFF FOLLOWED BY ONE OR TWO INVITED PAPERS BY NON-BUREAU RESEARCHERS, CONCLUDING WITH DISCUSSION BY EXPERTS AND AUDIENCE COMMENTS. ALAN GREENSPAN WILL DELIVER THE SHIRLEY KALLEK MEMORIAL LECTURE. JANET NORWOOD AND SIDNEY JONES WILL ALSO MAKE PRESENTATIONS.

DEMOGRAPHIC CENTERS IN THE SOUTH

IN THE LAST NEWSLETTER, WE REQUESTED REPORTS FROM DEMOGRAPHIC CENTERS IN THE REGION TO BE INCLUDED AS A REGULAR FEATURE FOR THE MEMBERS. IN THIS ISSUE, TWO GOVERNMENT CENTERS ARE FEATURED.

CENTER FOR INTERNATIONAL RESEARCH US BUREAU OF THE CENSUS

DEMOGRAPHIC RESEARCH IN THE CENTER COVERS ALL COUNTRIES, WITH EMPHASIS ON DEVELOPING NATIONS, CHINA, EASTERN EUROPE, AND THE SOVIET UNION. ANNUAL REPORTS ARE ISSUED IN THE WORLD POPULATION SERIES COVERING ALL 203 COUNTRIES OF THE WORLD. WORLD POPULATION 1983 WAS RELEASED IN DECEMBER 1983, AND WORLD POPULATION 1984 IS NOW AVAILABLE ALSO. RESEARCH ON THE POPULATION OF CHINA IS BASED ON 1982 CENSUS DATA AND A VAST ARCHIVE OF OTHER MATERIALS COLLECTED OVER TIME. CHINA'S CHANGING POPULATION BY JUDITH BANNISTER IS BEING PUBLISHED BY STANFORD UNIVERSITY PRESS. NEW POPULATION PROJECTIONS FOR THE 8 COMMUNIST COUNTRIES OF EASTERN EUROPE ARE BEING COMPLETED. POPULATION ESTIMATES AND PROJECTIONS BY AGE AND SEX FOR THE MAJOR NATIONALITY GROUPS AND REPUBLICS OF THE SOVIET UNION ARE IN PREPARATION.

THE CENTER HAS ESTABLISHED AN INTERNATIONAL DATA BASE CONTAINING STATISTICS ON DEMOGRAPHIC, SOCIAL, AND ECONOMIC TOPICS BY URBAN/RURAL RESIDENCE FOR SELECTED COUNTRIES IN AFRICA, ASIA, AND LATIN AMERICA, AND SUMMARY DEMOGRAPHIC DATA FOR ALL COUNTRIES. THE SYSTEM IS AVAILABLE ONLINE TO FEDERAL USERS AND ON A MACHINE-READABLE FILE TO ANYONE. ANALYTIC REPORTS HAVE ALSO BEEN ISSUED IN THE WOMEN OF THE WORLD SERIES FOR LATIN AMERICA AND THE CARIBBEAN AND FOR SUB-SAHARAN AFRICA, AS REPORTED IN THE SRDG NEWSLETTER, AND SIMILAR REPORTS WILL SOON BE ISSUED FOR ASIA AND THE PACIFIC AND FOR THE NEAR EAST AND NORTH AFRICA. NORTH CAROLINA CENTER FOR HEALTH STATISTICS

THE STATE CENTER FOR HEALTH STATISTICS (SCHS) IN NORTH CAROLINA, LOCATED WITHIN THE DIVISION OF HEALTH SERVICES OF STATE GOVERNMENT WHICH ADMINISTERS THE PUBLIC HEALTH PROGRAMS IN THE STATE, IS THE REPOSITORY OF ALL STATE VITAL RECORDS. SCHS ALSO MAINTAINS COMPUTER FILES OF OTHER TYPES OF HEALTH STATISTICS.

THE MAJOR RESPONSIBILITY OF SCHS IS TO PROVIDE STATISTICAL AND DATA PROCESSING SUPPORT TO THE HEALTH PROGRAMS IN THE DIVISION OF HEALTH SERVICES. OVER 1500

REQUESTS FROM PUBLIC AND PRIVATE ORGANIZATIONS AND THE GENERAL PUBLIC ARE ANSWERED EACH YEAR. AROUND 10 PUBLICATIONS ARE PRODUCED EACH YEAR AS WELL AS PERIODIC STUDIES ON SPECIAL RESEARCH TOPICS. SCHS IS WORKING UNDER A 2 YEAR GRANT FROM THE NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH (NIOSH) TO CODE AND ANALYZE OCCUPATION AND INDUSTRY FROM DEATH CERTIFICATES AND TO INVESTIGATE OTHER SOURCES OF DATA ON THE RELATIONSHIP OF OCCUPATION AND MORTALITY AND MORBIDITY. SCHS HAS A 2 YEAR PROJECT FUNDED BY NIH TO PROVIDE DATA FOR AND PARTICIPATE IN A STUDY OF "MULTINATIONAL COMPARISONS OF BIRTH WEIGHT SPECIFIC PERINATAL MORTALITY RATES."
