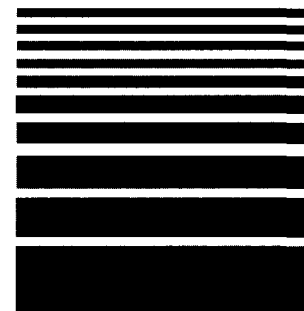

## **Final Call for Papers - Deadline Extended**

**T**he deadline to submit proposals for papers and sessions at the 2002 annual meeting of the Southern Demographic Association has been extended until **30 June 2002**.

This year's meeting will be held October 10-12 at the Omni Hotel in Austin, Texas.

Presentations of research in both applied and theoretical demography are welcome, as are related topics in economics, sociology, geography, political science, and psychology. The Southern Demographic Association is a regional US organization but encourages the participation of individuals, and the study of demographic topics, from any region or country.

SDA arranges meeting programs in a much more informal manner than large organizations such as Population Association of America. We gather proposals for individual presentations and then organize them into themed sessions, rather than the other way around. The structure of meeting presentations is also flexible: we encourage potential contributors to organize not only standard sessions, but also roundtables, software demonstrations, panel discussions, and workshops.

The SDA meeting is a particularly good venue for student participation. We encourage presentations by students, and we award a (very modest) cash prize to the best student undergraduate and graduate papers.

Stubb's is the most respected name in barbecue, not only for the food that he served, but for the way that he lived his life and treated others. Christopher B. "Stubb" Stubblefield opened his first restaurant in Lubbock in 1968, across from the county fairgrounds. He made his first barbecue in the hickory pit behind his place and filled the jukebox with vintage blues music. It was here that Stubb's Legendary Bar-B-Q was born.
