**Recent Trends and Future Prospects for  
Mortality Research**

*SDA Plenary Speaker 2017*



**Rick Rogers** is Professor of Sociology and IBS Population Program Faculty Affiliate at the University of Colorado. His main research interests focus on social demography and medical sociology. Much of his previous work examined social, demographic, and behavioral differences in adult mortality. For example, with Eileen Crimmins (University of Southern California), he coedited the *International Handbook of Adult Mortality* (2011, Springer). He is currently collaborating with coauthors Bob Hummer (University of North Carolina) and Patrick Krueger (University of Colorado Denver) to revise and update his chapter, "Adult Mortality," for the new edition of the *Handbook of Population* (New York: Kluwer Springer). And his ongoing NICHD-funded project with Bob Hummer examines differences in early life mortality. Overall, his research endeavors to better understand ways to improve health and lengthen life.

Victoria (Tori) Velkoff is the Chief of the American Community Survey Office at the U.S. Census Bureau. In this capacity, she directs the work on the American Community Survey (ACS), which is the leading source of social, demographic, economic, and housing information for the nation, states, counties, cities, and towns. Tori is leading the research effort to improve the ACS and reduce respondent burden.

Tori also has served as the Chief of the Social, Economic, and Housing Statistics Division, Chief of the Population Division, and Assistant Division Chief of the Estimates and Projections Area in the Population Division, all at the U.S. Census Bureau. Tori has received several Department of Commerce Bronze Medal Awards for her work on demographic analysis, the American Community Survey content test, housing unit based estimates research, and sample vital registration in developing countries.
